BULL TERRIER CLUB (UK) WELFARE TRUST

The Bull Terrier Club Welfare Trust covers the whole of the UK and is administered by the Managing Committee of the Welfare Trust. Their main objective is to look after Bull Terriers whose owners can no longer keep them and who would otherwise be put to sleep.

It must be stressed that the owner should first seek help from the breeder and that together they should vigorously seek suitable new owners and homes. The Bull Terrier (UK) Welfare Trust is an emergency service and must never be used as an easy answer for any persons who should reasonably be expected to make satisfactory arrangements on their own behalf.

Help is always needed with transport and/or kennel accommodation and in finding suitable homes for animals that come into the scheme. All owners can help by thinking twice before allowing their bitches to be bred from or allowing their stud dogs to be used. When puppies are available they should ensure that prospective owners are carefully vetted and that they as breeders provide a lifelong 'after sales' service to ensure that the dogs are cared for and enjoy good health.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Open Show will open at 9.00 am. The Major Trophy Show will open at 10.00am.
2. Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
3. Judging will commence for the Open Show at 9.30 am. Judging will commence for the Major Trophy Show at 10.30am.
4. Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
5. ENTRY FEES: Members: £8.00 first entry per dog. Subsequent entries same dog: £2.00. Non-Members: £10.00 first entry per dog. Subsequent entries same dog £2.00. Not for Competition: £5.00. Single Entry Major Trophies £15.00 per dog/bitch (Not per Trophy). You may enter online at www.dog.biz.
6. There is no prize money on offer at this show.
7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
9. The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
10. **Best Puppy in Show.** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it should automatically be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it should also automatically be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
11. **Best in Show.** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
14. All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
15. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
16. **DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered. **Regulation F.1.c** Only dogs of six calendar months of age and over on the first day of the show are eligible for exhibition at Kennel Club licensed shows. However societies may accept Not for Competition entries at their discretion and dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Not for Competition at **all Kennel Club licensed Shows**. Furthermore, dogs aged four calendar months and over are eligible to enter Match Competitions.
19. No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine press wherever possible.
20. Exercise Area. An exercise area will be provided. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
21. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club Licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan park and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set-up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
22. Any dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by scheduled judges, (this shall not apply to a Judge appointed in an emergency), or b) exhibited without payment of appropriate entry fees.
23. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.
24. Should a Judge be prevented from fulfilling his/her engagement the committee reserve the right to appoint another in his/her place. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
25. Judges will be instructed and empowered to withhold the prize or prizes in any class if in their opinion the dog or dogs exhibited do not possess sufficient merit. Judges are not empowered to give prizes beyond those offered in the schedule of prizes.
26. No animal other than a dog duly entered at this show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance. Members wishing to bring their dogs Not for Competition must complete an entry form (included with this schedule).
27. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs any alteration made in the schedule shall be deemed sufficient notice thereof.

28. If acknowledgement is required an addressed and stamped postcard with 'receipt' written on the reverse should be enclosed the Hon. Show Manager's signature.
29. The committee is empowered to exclude or to remove any dog which is not in a fit state for exhibition owing to disease, savage disposition or any other cause and the entry fee will be forfeited.
30. The committee will be most anxious for the care and safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be distinctly understood by exhibitors and all the other persons that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to any dogs or other property whether arising from accident or other causes whatsoever, or from any act or omission of itself, its officers, agents, servants or others.
31. Should any question arise which is not provided for in these Regulations, the decision of the committee shall be final, subject to appeal to the Kennel Club.

Regulations For The Preparation of Dogs For Exhibition F (Annex B)

1. These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A 42.
 - a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
 - b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A 42.
2.
 - a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the Show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the Show.
 - b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
3. No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:
 - (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - (b) The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown.
 - (d) Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
6. Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS

Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Limited Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulations to refuse any entry.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of **Postal** entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Saturday 18th January 2020**. Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering for Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. A First Prize does not include a Special Prize of whatever value.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) *Withdrawal*

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulations F.(1).19.

(2) *Transfer*

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) If an exhibit is entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy class, Puppy class or Junior class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy class, Junior class or Yearling class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT: For dogs which have not become show Champions under Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club or won more than 3 CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars, or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes, confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breed for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN: For dogs of seven years and over on the first day of the Show.

NOT FOR COMPETITION: Puppies of four to under one day off six months may be entered at this show Not For Competition; The entry fee will be £5.00 per dog taken on the day. In offering this the officers and committee expect all puppies to be under strict adult control.

From the Motorway

North (M1)

Leave the M1 at Junction 21 onto the M69. Take the M6 North to Junction 3 exiting onto the A444 towards Coventry, follow the dual carriageway with Macro on your left-hand side. Carry straight over the bridge with Tesco's to your left. At the second roundabout turn right into Holbrook Way (Guest Trucks on left). Turn left onto Holbrook Lane, then first right onto Tamworth Road, signposted Tamworth A51, follow Tamworth Road past St. Thomas Church on your right and the Old Hall Pub on your left for at least 400 yards, turn right just after Sandpits Lane. Here you will find The Royal Court Hotel in Coventry.

North West (M6)

Leave the M6 at Junction 3, at the roundabout follow signs for A444 follow the dual carriageway with Macro on your left-hand side. Carry straight over the bridge with Tesco to your left. At the second roundabout turn right into Holbrook Way (Guest Trucks on left). Turn left onto Holbrook Lane, then first right onto Tamworth Road, signposted Tamworth A51. Follow Tamworth Road past St. Thomas Church on your right and the Old Hall Pub on your left for at least 400 yards, turn right after Sandpits Lane. Here you will find The Royal Court Hotel in Coventry.

South West (M5/M42)

Leave the M42 at Junction 6 onto the A45 towards Coventry. Take the slip road exit for Coventry A4114 (just after Coventry Hill Hotel on the left-hand side). At the roundabout take the second exit signposted City Centre, Allesley Jaguar Assembly Plant & Brownhill Green. At the next roundabout take the 2nd Exit onto Coundon Wedge signposted Browns Lane Plant and Keresley. Follow onto next roundabout straight across (Jaguar on your left-hand side). At next roundabout straight across onto Long Lane (Garden Centre on your right-hand side). Follow onto T Junction, at T Junction turn right onto Tamworth Road, the Royal Court Hotel is located 100 yards on your left.

South (M40)

Leave the M40 at Junction 15 onto the A46 towards Coventry. Then turn left onto A45 towards Birmingham. Go straight across at the 1st roundabout following the A45 towards Birmingham. Go straight across at a number of traffic lights, and straight across at the next roundabout. There are several more sets of traffic lights, so continue straight across these, remaining on the A45. At the next roundabout take the exit signposted A4114 City Centre, Allesley Jaguar assembly plant & Brownhill Green. At the next roundabout take the 2nd exit onto Coundon Wedge, signposted Browns Lane Plant & Keresley. Follow onto next roundabout straight across (Jaguar on your left-hand side). At next roundabout straight across onto Long Lane (Garden Centre on your right-hand side). Follow onto T Junction, at T Junction turn right onto Tamworth Road, the Royal Court Hotel is located 100 yards on your left.

South (M1)

Leave the M1 at Junction 17 onto the M45/A45 to Coventry. Continue along the A45 towards Birmingham over several roundabouts and traffic lights. Take the exit signposted A4114 Allesley, Allesley Jaguar Assembly Plant & Brownhill Green. At the next roundabout take the 2nd exit onto Coundon Wedge, signposted Browns Lane Plant & Keresley. Follow onto next roundabout straight across (Jaguar on your left-hand side). At next roundabout straight across onto Long Lane (Garden Centre on your right-hand side). Follow onto T Junction, at T Junction turn right onto Tamworth Road, the Royal Court Hotel is located 100 yards on your left.
